On the last day of school we **close at 2pm**, please arrange for your child to be collected at this time.





EYFS



During the past couple of weeks, the children in EYFS have enjoyed reading and completing activities based on the story Owl Babies by Martin Waddell. We've thought about how owls move and what they sound like, we've decorated owl biscuits (and eaten them!), made owls using various crafting materials and discussed the life cycle of owls.









Year 1 and 2

Hazel class have been busy writing their first independent 5 sentence story based on the book Tiddler by Julia Donaldson. We also took part in an online zoom meet where we got to meet Nick Sharratt and Pippa Goodhart where we read the story 'You Choose Christmas' and draw christmas characters along with Nick. 


My Name is Helen Gormanly and I am the new school nurse for Ings Primary School.
